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Speaker Biographies



Barry DuVal **President & CEO** **Virginia Chamber of Commerce**

Barry DuVal was named president and CEO of the Virginia Chamber of Commerce on April 28, 2010.

Under his leadership, the Chamber has become Virginia's largest business advocacy group, growing from 847 members in 2010 to more than 26,000 members today. In 2013, the Chamber produced Blueprint Virginia – the Commonwealth's first comprehensive business-led initiative to provide direction and long-term economic development planning for Virginia. In 2017, the Chamber released an update to the original Blueprint, Blueprint Virginia 2025, which engaged over 6,000 business and community leaders from around the Commonwealth to build an action plan for strengthening Virginia's economic competitiveness and getting Virginia back to the top of business climate rankings.

Barry's public service began in 1988 when he was elected to the Newport News City Council. In 1990 he was elected mayor of the city. He served as mayor from 1990 through 1996, when he stepped down to become the president and CEO of a regional economic development organization representing Southeast Virginia's 1.6 million citizens.

From 1998 through 2002 Barry served as the Secretary of Commerce and Trade for the Commonwealth of Virginia. During his term as Secretary, Virginia attracted a record-setting 1,500 economic development projects representing 156,850 new jobs and \$13.7 billion in private investment.

His private sector experience includes serving as president and CEO of DuVal Associates, Inc, a diversified real estate firm, from 1983-1996. Upon the completion of his term as the Secretary of Commerce and Trade, he served as president and CEO of Kaufman & Canoles Consulting, LLC, an economic development consulting firm specializing in public-private partnerships and strategic planning for business and government agencies.

Barry holds a Master's (MLS) from American University Washington College of Law and a BS from James Madison University.

Paige currently serves on the Executive Committee of the Virginia Chamber of Commerce Board as Chair for 2020 and on the Advisory Board of SingleStone Consulting. She is past Treasurer of the Board of Family Lifeline and served on the Virginia Advisory Board of South State Bank.

Paige obtained her bachelor's degree in finance from Virginia Tech and a master's degree in business administration from Virginia Commonwealth University. She is certified by the Society for Human Resources Management (SHRM) as a Senior Professional in Human Resources (SPHR).

Brent Archer has served as President of Columbia Gas of Virginia since April 2015. In March 2018 he assumed the additional role of Chief Operating Officer and is responsible for overall Virginia operating company performance. With headquarters in Chester, Columbia Gas of Virginia operates more than 5,000 miles of natural gas lines and seven regional offices, serving nearly 275,000 residential, commercial and industrial natural gas customers in 91 communities across Virginia.

Archer has served in a variety of leadership positions at the Columbia Gas companies. Prior to being named President and COO, he served as Director of Business Policy, having responsibility for the company's legislative, regulatory and customer energy efficiency programs. He has nearly 35 years' experience in the natural gas industry in communications, government policy and regulatory affairs, beginning his career with Columbia Gas in 1986.

He holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Journalism from Marshall University, and an MBA from the West Virginia University Graduate College. He is the Immediate Past President of the Virginia Oil & Gas Association and he currently serves as Chairman of the Board for the Chesterfield County Food Bank. He is a 2009 graduate of Lead Virginia, and additionally serves on the Board of Directors of the Virginia Chamber of Commerce and the Virginia Business Council. Archer and his wife Dr. Andrea Archer and their two children live in Midlothian VA.

Stewart Leeth serves as vice president of regulatory affairs and chief sustainability officer for Smithfield Foods, Inc. In this role, Leeth leads company-wide regulatory initiatives and directs the company's sustainability program. This program focuses on animal welfare, employee relations, environmental stewardship, food safety and quality, and community development. He is also responsible for legal affairs for Smithfield's hog production division and serves as vice president of the Smithfield Foundation.

Leeth originally joined Smithfield Foods in 2008 and has worked in several capacities for the company. Most recently he served vice president of regulatory affairs and sustainability. He also held the position of assistant vice president of environmental and corporate affairs and senior counsel.

Prior to joining Smithfield Foods, Leeth was a partner at the Virginia law firm of McGuireWoods, where he represented the firm's clients before federal and state courts and agencies in matters involving major federal and state environmental statutes, water rights disputes, cost recovery and contaminated property litigation, rulemaking, and permitting. He also focused on state and local government matters and land use disputes.

Leeth formerly served as Assistant Attorney General for the Commonwealth of Virginia, representing a variety of state agencies and also served as a law clerk to Judge Claude Hilton of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Virginia. Leeth is a graduate of the University of Richmond School of Law and earned a bachelor of arts degree in international studies from the University of Richmond.

Ken Sullivan joined Smithfield Foods in 2003 and assumed the role of President and Chief Executive Officer, in 2016. Based at the global food company's headquarters in Smithfield, Virginia, he guides its vision and strategic direction across operations in the United States, Poland, Romania, the United Kingdom, and joint ventures in Mexico.

Mr. Sullivan drives a culture of continuous improvement by championing the company's three guiding principles of Responsibility, Operational Excellence, and Innovation. He has focused on growing Smithfield's business in a sustainable way through robust animal care, community involvement, employee safety, environmental, and food safety and quality programs.

A Virginia native, Mr. Sullivan graduated from Virginia Commonwealth University in 1988 with a Bachelor of Science in accounting.
